### YEAR 8 HISTORY VISIT TO YPRES

42 Year 8 students and 5 teachers braved windy Channel crossings and cold wet weather to experience life in First World War trenches near Ypres in the last week of term.

This is an invaluable field visit that brings the rigours of the war to life, as well as being a chance to experience a little of what Belgium has to offer. Students visited contrasting cemeteries at Langemark and Tyne Cot, seeing the differences between the German and Commonwealth Graves. We placed a wreath at the Menim Gate after the Last Post, following supper in a nice restaurant in festive Ypres.


The highlight of the field visit was again the mud and water filled trenches at Hill 62. Many students braved the pitch black tunnels between the trenches, others waded round the zigzagged lines imagining life for days on end in these places at the height of the war. The students who went will now be "experts" in the classroom and will be able to bring their memories to their class during terms 3 and 4 as the History Department embarks on its study of war and conflict through the ages. As ever, the students behaved impeccably.

### **GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP**

On 5<sup>th</sup> December Year 10 GCSE Geography students went on a 5 day residential trip. They stayed in Nettlecombe Court Field Studies Centre in Somerset, a beautiful manor house at the eastern edge of Exmoor National Park. They collected primary data and completed their controlled assessment.



It was a very cold week and all students worked hard at measuring river widths, depth, flow velocity,



material size and drawing sketches at the different stages of the river.

By the end of the week the group, whilst tired, had completed their controlled assessment (25% of their final grade), had a much clearer understanding of the processes at work in rivers and had a fun time!

#### YEAR 7 & 8 LEARNING THEMES/TOPICS


