1	<p><u>CA - Imaginative writing A and B (if not completed in Y10)</u></p> <p><u>Information and Ideas writing skills - in preparation for exam</u></p>	<p>Students may complete both 2015 tasks if not already completed in Y10. This is worth 15% of their English Language grade. Student will be assessed on their ability to write texts that are tailored to audience and purpose. The assessment of both tasks will be done in lessons and students are allowed to take planning notes into the assessments.</p> <p>Students will complete a baseline assessment using past papers. They will be assessed on their writing skills under exam conditions. They will have one hour to plan and write the assessment. This element of the exam is worth 30% of their final GCSE grade</p>
2	<p><u>Spoken Language CA (for English Language)</u></p> <p><u>OMAM CA (for English Language)</u></p>	<p>Students will complete one 2016 task. This is worth 10% of their English Language grade. Student will be assessed on their ability to understand how language is adapted to different purposes. The assessment of this task will be done in lessons and students are allowed to take planning notes into the assessments.</p> <p>Students will complete one 2016 task. This is worth 15% of their English Language grade Student will be assessed on their ability to reflect on key themes and ideas within texts. The assessment will be done in lessons and students are allowed</p>
3	<p><u>Information and Ideas Reading</u></p>	<p>Student will be assessed on their ability to identify audience and purpose of texts. They will be required to write about the effects of language and presentation on an audience as well as how to identify writers' views. Students will practise summarising texts, using quotations and writing about the effects created by writers. This element of the examination is worth 30% of their final GCSE grade for English.</p>
4	<p><u>Information & Ideas exam revision</u></p>	<p>The examination for English Language is worth 60% of their final mark (30% for reading and 30% for writing as detailed above). Students will be assessed on their ability to read and understand texts as well as their writing skills.</p>

	<u>English Literature revision (if retaking/ taking for the first time)</u>	Students wishing to re-sit or who have not yet sat the English Literature exam will revisit key texts taught in Y9 and 10 throughout Y11 as part of their home learning and in after school classes. In this term revision may also form part of lessons.
